They are newbie friendly.

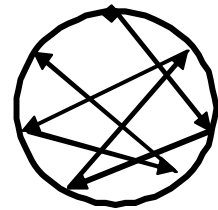
II. What do they look like?

Read a paragraph, launch questions for interaction.

Stop when time is up resume there the next week (group paced).



III. Who needs them?

People who are just beginning the journey.

People who are not ready for a higher commitment group.

People who like to help others discover the relevance of the Bible.

IV. How do they fit here?

We will start some of these groups and expand as needed.

These groups complement the other types of groups we offer.

This approach can be incorporated into various ministry situations.
