

Bible Study Methods Lesson One

I. A Three Step Process

Observation: "What Do I See?"

There are basically four things to look for:

- 1. Terms
- 2. Structure
 - A. Grammatical Structure
 - B. Literary Structure
- 3. Literary Form
- 4. Atmosphere

Interpretation: "What Does it Mean?"

Three things will help us discover the meaning of a passage:

- 1. Bombard the text with questions
- 2. Look for the answers to your questions.
- 3. Seek to integrate the parts with the whole.

Application: "How Does it Work?"

There are two things to look for in this process:

- 1. How does it work for me?
- 2. How does it work for others?

Note: Two out of three ain't good!

Reading Rules:

Rule #1: Learn to read better and faster.

- There is a direct correlation between you *efficiency* in reading and your *effectiveness* in Bible Study.
- Mortimer J. Adler and Mark Van Doren, <u>How to Read a Book</u> (Simon & Schuster, 1972).

Rule #2: Learn to read as for the first time.


 A good suggestion for reading the Word of God freshly is to read it in several different translations.

Rule #3: Learn to read it as a love letter.

- We need to come to the Word of God in love with the Person who wrote it.

Assignments:

#1 Take a familiar small household object [ex. your key chain, your toothbrush], a pen and a pad of paper. Spend five minutes making a list of observations about it. Repeat this process at least 3 times during the week adding new observations each time to your list. Bring your list and [if practical] your object next week and be prepared to share.

#2 Use the above process to make observations on a familiar passage: Matthew 28:18-20. Be sure to bring your list of observations next week. Don't get frustrated if this seems hard or confusing. As we discuss your observations next week the process will become clearer.
